The imageRUNNER ADVANCE C9280 PRO/C9270 PRO/C7270/C7260 incorporates a rich array of input and output features that can greatly enhance your efficiency. Equipped with features that meet the needs of document work in a digitized office, the imageRUNNER ADVANCE C9280 PRO/C9270 PRO/C7270/C7260 represents the ultimate in a color digital multitasking machines.



You can make two-sided copies from one-sided originals or copy two pages onto one side of the paper to reduce printing cost. There are other modes, such as the Collate modes. (p. 28)



Scanned documents as well as stored files and computer data can be sent by facsimile. You can also send documents to multiple addresses and forward received facsimile to another destination. Also, by using Remote Fax sending function, you can share the Fax function on the same network. (p. 34)

 Send Documents (E-Mail/Fax/I-Fax/File Server/Store in Mail Box)

You can send scanned documents by e-mail or l-fax, as well as store them on a network file server. You can also store sent documents in the Mail Box. (p. 40)

Use Memory Media

You can scan and store documents in the memory media connected to the USB port. You can also print stored files directly from the memory media. (p. 46, p. 50)

Use Mail Box (Store/Print/Send)

You can store scanned documents or data from a computer in a mail box. You can print documents stored in a mail box, and sent them to other destinations. (p. 46, p. 50)



Use Advanced Box

You can set a file format to the scanned document so that it can be accessed from your computer. You can also store files in the Advanced Box with a file format that can be used on your computer. The stored data can be shared by accessing it from a computer. The Advanced Box can also be accessed from other imageRUNNER ADVANCE machines for operations, such as printing stored data. (p. 46, p. 50)



Use Remote Scanner

You can use this machine as a remote scanner by TWAIN compatible computer software. You can scan up to 11" x 17" in size at a resolution of 600 x 600 dpi. (See e-Manual > Scanner.)



Print Secured File

You can send print data protected with a PIN/password from a computer to the machine. This data can be printed only by entering the correct PIN/password on the machine. This enables you to print without unauthorized people viewing your data. (See e-Manual > Secure Print.)



Printing a Fax/I-Fax File in the Memory RX inbox

If Memory RX is set, files received by Fax/I-Fax function are not printed, but stored in the Memory RX Inbox. You can print the stored files whenever necessary. This can help prevent outputs being forgotten at the machine. (See e-Manual > Fax/I-Fax Inbox.)



View Web Page

You can use this machine to browse Web pages from the touch panel display of the machine or print PDF files on the Web pages. (See e-Manual > Web Access.)

Use Hold

You can hold (temporarily store) data for print jobs in the machine. For more information, see the e-Manual.

Main Power and Energy Saver Key

This section describes how to use the main power switch and the Energy Saver key.



WARNING

Do not connect or disconnect the power cord with wet hands, as this may result in electrical shock.


How to Turn ON the Main Power

Make sure that the power plug is firmly inserted into the power outlet and that the Security Key is in the ON positions (turn it to the right) if it is inserted into the machine, and then turn ON the main power of the machine following the procedure below.

- 1. Open the main power switch cover.
- 2. Press the main power switch to the "I" side.
- 3. Close the main power switch cover.



- If you are using a login service, log in using the procedure for the login service you are using.
- If the main power indicator on the control panel does not light even though the main power switch is ON, be sure to check the breaker to see if it is OFF
- If you want to turn OFF the main power and then back ON again, wait for at least 10 seconds after the main power indicator is turned OFF before turning ON the main power.




Shutting Down the Machine

This machine performs a procedure to protect hard disk when the machine is shut down. This enables the machine to be shut down safely, even if there are any jobs being processed, or a MEAP application is running while the machine is shutting down.

- 1. Open the main power switch cover.
- Press the main power switch to the "\bundermath{\text{\text{"}}}" side. 2.
- 3. Close the main power switch cover.



- Do not turn the main power OFF while using the Fax/I-Fax function. Sending or receiving I-fax or fax documents cannot be done when the main power is turned OFF.
- If the message <Backing up stored data from the Remote UI...> is displayed on the touch panel display, do not turn the main power OFF. This may cause the machine to fail to back up the stored data.
- Data stored in the machine may be damaged if the Advanced Box is accessed by another imageRUNNER ADVANCE machine or a computer immediately before the machine shuts down.
- The machine may take some time to completely shutdown. Do not unplug the power cord until the main power indicator of the machine is OFF.
- If the main power is turned OFF during scanning or printing, a paper jam may occur.
- If you set [Quick Startup Settings for Main Power] to 'On' in [Preferences] (Settings/Registration), the tone sounds when turning OFF the main power of the machine. (Depending on the situations, the machine does not startup quickly and the tone does not sound.)




Energy Saver Key







1 USB Port (1)

Use the USB port to connect a USB device.

2 Control Panel

Includes the keys, touch panel display, and indicators required for operating the machine. (See "Control Panel and Touch Panel Display," on p. 18.)

Main Power Switch

Press to the "I" side to turn the power ON. (See "Control Panel and Touch Panel Display," on p. 18.)

4 Security Key (Optional)

For managing the use of the machine and preventing unauthorized copies.

Multi-Purpose Tray

Use the multi-purpose tray to feed paper manually, and for loading nonstandard paper stock, such as envelopes.

Main Unit's Lower Right Cover

Open this cover when clearing a paper jam inside the main unit.

Main Unit's Upper Right Cover

Open this cover when clearing a paper jam inside the main unit.

8 Paper Drawer 3, 4

Holds up to 550 sheets of paper (20 lb bond (80 g/m²)).

Paper Drawer 1, 2 (Right/Left)

Holds up to 1,100 sheets of paper (20 lb bond (80 g/m²)).

10 LAN Port

Use a LAN cable to connect the machine to a network.

USB Port (2)

Use the USB port to connect external hard disks and other devices to the machine.

USB Connector

Use a USB cable to connect the machine to a computer.

13 Left Cover

Open this cover when clearing a paper jam inside the main unit.

Breaker

Detects excess current or leakage current.

15 Test Button

Press this button to periodically test the circuit breaker.

16 LINE 4

Use this port to connect the Super G3 3rd/4th Line Fax Board to the machine

U LINE 3

Use this port to connect the Super G3 3rd/4th Line Fax Board to the machine

18 LINE 2

Use this port to connect the Super G3 2nd Line Fax Board to the machine.



Front Cover

Open this cover to clear a paper jam in the fixing transport unit.


2 Fixing Transport Unit

3 Toner Replacement Cover
Open this cover to replace the toner cartridge.

4 Toner Cartridge
When toner runs out, pull out the toner cartridge, and replace it with a new one.

Processing/Data Indicator

Flashes or blinks green when the machine is performing operations, and maintains a steady green light when fax data is stored in memory.

2 Error Indicator

Flashes or lights if there is an error in the machine. When the Error indicator flashes, follow the instructions that appear on the touch panel display. When the Error indicator maintains a steady red light, contact your local authorized Canon dealer.

Settings/Registration key

Press to specify settings/registration.

4 Energy Saver key

Press to set or cancel the Sleep mode. Lights when the machine enters the Sleep mode.

5 Counter Check key

Press to display the copy and print count totals on the touch panel display.

6 Numeric keys

Press to enter numerical values.

7 Clear key

Press to clear entered values or characters.

8 Main Power Indicator

Lights when the main power is turned ON.

9 Edit Per

Use when operating the touch panel display, such as to enter characters. If you lose the edit pen, contact your local authorized Canon dealer. Do not use an object with a sharp end on the control panel, such as a pencil or ballpoint pen, in place of the edit pen.

10 Stop key

Press to stop a job in progress, such as a scan, copy, or fax (scanning only) job.

Start key

Press to start an operation.

Reset key

Press to restore the standard settings of the machine.

13 ID (Log In/Out) key



Logging In/Out

If you are managing the machine with a login service, such as Department ID Management or SSO-H (Single Sign-On H), a log in screen appears. If the log in screen appears, enter the Department ID and PIN or the user name and password \rightarrow press 0 (Log In/Out) or [Log In] on the screen. Press 0 (Log In/Out) or [Log Out] after you finish using the machine to log out.



Use Help

If ? (Help) is displayed on the top right of the function setting screen, press ? (Help) to check the explanation of the function or how to specify settings. Press to check the explanation of the function or how to specify settings.



Main Menu Screen Settings

You can specify settings for the displayed screen by pressing 🚺 on the top right of the screen. To perform this procedure, log in to the machine as an administrator.



- The items displayed when 🚺 is pressed may differ, depending on the function.
- If authentication function is used, items displayed may differ or 1 may not be available, depending on the login user's privileges.



Specifying the Main Menu Settings

You can set the number of buttons and the layout displayed on the Main Menu screen.

- 1. Press \longrightarrow [Main Menu Button Display Settings].
- 2. Press or to select the number of buttons and the layout to be displayed.
- 3. Select the function that appears on the list \rightarrow change the order in which it is displayed.
- 4. Press [OK].



- Select the function that appears on the list and press [Up] or [Down] to change the order in which it is displayed.
- You can place or delete one blank button space by pressing [Add Blank] or [Delete Blank], respectively.

Top Buttons Settings

You can display up to two function shortcut buttons on the top of the screen.

- 2. Select the shortcut button and the function to assign to it.
- 3. Press [OK].



If you do not want to select a function, press [Unassigned].

Setting the Main Menu Wallpaper

You can select the wallpaper for the Main Menu screen.

- 1. Press → [Main Menu Wallpaper Settings].
- 2. Select the wallpaper.
- 3. Press [OK].

You can set whether the shortcut buttons for modes, such as changing the displayed language or changing the paper settings for copying/printing are displayed on the Main Menu screen.

- 1. Press

- 2. Specify the other settings.

If <Display [Language/Keyboard Switch]> is set to 'On', 🚼 appears on the Main Menu

If <Display [Settings/Reg.Shortcut]> is set to 'On', [Settings/Reg.Shortcut] appears on the Main Menu screen.

From [Settings/Reg.Shortcut], you can select shortcut buttons to the setting screens for [Auto Adjust Gradation], [Paper Settings], and [Paper Type Management Settings].

If <Display [Show All]> is set to 'On', [Show All] appears on the Main Menu screen.




Example of Customized Screen

Changing Settings According to Your Needs



The Settings/Registration screen appears when you press (Settings/Registration) on the control panel.

The machine provides various settings that enable you to use it more conveniently and easily. You can register or change the settings according to your needs. For more information, see e-Manual > Settings/Registration.

Preferences

You can specify basic settings for using the machine, such as changing the paper size to load, changing the default screen to display, setting the date and time, setting the time it takes to enter the low power mode, and specifying the settings for connecting to a network.

Adjustment/Maintenance

You can specify settings for using the machine more comfortably, such as adjusting the density, adjusting the gradation, and cleaning the feeder.

Function Settings

You can specify and register settings for using each function more conveniently, such as registering shortcut buttons for the Copy function, setting automatic redialing for the Fax function, and setting the maximum data size to send via e-mail.

Set Destination

You can register fax and e-mail destinations in the address book. In addition to registering frequently used destinations, you can also register multiple destinations as a group, enabling you to send to those destinations at the same time. You can also register different types of destinations (e-mail and file server) as a group.

Management Settings

You can set the administrator settings for managing the machine. This enables you to set an ID and password for each department, manage confidential information, and count the number of pages printed for each ID. You can also register licenses and certificates.

How to Make a Copy


This section describes the functions you can use on the [Options] (2/3 and 3/3) screen of the Copy function. The [Options] screen is divided into three screens. [Options] 2/3



You can embed hidden text, such as "CONFIDENTIAL" in the background of copies. The embedded text appears when the copies are printed, helping prevent unauthorized copying and information leakage.



You can embed tracking information in copies. This increases security by preventing unauthorized copies.

- [Color Balance]

[Shift]

Press to cancel the selection of a file. For a mail box, if you cancel a selection, this switches to [Select All (Max 100 Files)].

List/Thumbnail

Press to select view settings of the files stored in a mail box.

[Print List]

You can print a list of files stored in a mail box.

[Print]

Press to display the Print Settings screen.

[Sand]

Press to send a file stored in the mail box.

[Edit File]

Press to display the menu for adding or deleting a file, or displaying the detailed information of a file.

[Display Image]

This mode enables you to preview the stored file and check the page count.

[Details]

You can check the detailed information of the stored file.

Edit File Screen

[Delete]

You can delete stored files. You can erase unnecessary files and arrange the storage location.

[Merge Multiple Files]

You can combine multiple files in the mail box into one file. Then you can print the combined files as one file.

[Insert Pages]

You can insert a specified file from the mail box in front of the specified page of another file from the same mail box.

[Delete Pages]

This mode enables you to erase specified page from a file that is stored in a mail box.

[Add Files (Scan and Store)]

You can scan the original and store the new file in the selected storage location.

[Change File Name]

You can change a file name.

[Move/Duplicate]

You can move or duplicate files stored in the mail box.






Things You Can Do with the Access Stored Files Functions (Print)

This section describes the functions on the Print Settings screen that you can use when printing stored files. If you select the file that you want to print from the list of stored files and press [Print], the following screen is displayed. Optional products are required to print PDF/XPS files.





Print Screen

- [Select Color]
 You can select color mode for printing.
- [Select Paper]
 You can select the paper size/type and the paper source. You can also set the machine to automatically select the paper size to match the size of the stored original.
- [Print Sample]
 You can check the print result of one set before making multiple sets of prints. You can also print a specified page.
- [Restore Settings]/[Change Print Settings]
 You can change or restore the print settings.
- [Favorite Settings]
 This mode enables you to register frequently used print settings. You can recall the registered frequently used settings for future use.
- [Merge Files and Print]
 Press to merge multiple files and print as one file. This key is displayed only when multiple files are selected.
- [Delete File After Printing]
 Press to have a file automatically deleted after it is printed.
- [Restore Default Set.] Press to cancel all settings.

- 9 [Start Printing]
 Press to start printing.
- [Change No. of Copies]
 Press to set the number of prints when multiple files are selected.
 - * Displayed only when print settings have not been changed.
- [Store Settings]
 Press to store the print settings.
 - * Displayed only when using the Mail Box. Cannot be used when multiple files are selected.
- [2-Sided Printing]
 This mode enables you to print successive pages of a stored file on both sides of a sheet of paper.
- [Finishing]
 You can collate prints in page order or into groups of the same page. You can staple the printed sheets.
 - * To staple printed sheets, optional products are required.
- Print Range You can set the print range using [All Pages] or [Specify Pages].






Things You Can Do with the Access Stored Files Functions (Print)

This section describes the functions you can use on the [Options] (1/2 and 2/2) screen of the Access Stored Files function. The [Options] screen is divided into two screens. Pressing on the bottom right of the screen displays the next or previous screen.





[Options] (Mail Box)

- [Add Cover]
 You can add covers.
- [Insert Sheets]/[Job Separator]
 Press to insert blank sheets or chapter pages between specified pages. When multiple files are selected, job separator sheets are inserted.
- [Booklet]
 You can layout the files to print a booklet. You can also print a cover sheet or make a saddle stitch booklet.
 - * To make a saddle stitch booklet, optional products are required.
- [Shift]
 You can shift the position of the image to print to the desired position.
- [Gutter]
 This mode enables you to print with the entire original image shifted by a designated width to create a margin on the prints. You can set different width values for the each side of the paper.
- [Print Date]
 This mode enables you to print the date onto the output. You can specify the size, position, or direction of the date.
- [Watermark]
 This mode enables you to print a watermark and user-defined text onto the output. You can specify the size, position, or direction.
- [Copy Set Numbering]
 This mode enables you to print copy set numbers. You can specify the size, position, or direction of the copy set number.
 - specify the size, position, or direction of the copy set number.

[Page Numbering]

You can print with page numbers. You can also specify the size, position, or direction of the page number.

[Secure Watermark]



You can embed hidden text, such as "CONFIDENTIAL" in the background of prints. The embedded text appears when the copies are printed, helping prevent unauthorized copying and information leakage.


[Document Scan Lock]




You can embed tracking information in prints. This increases security by preventing unauthorized copies.

- [Superimpose Image]
 This mode superimposes an image (image form) previously scanned, registers it in the memory of the machine, and then combines it with the file to print.
- [Print on Tab]
 Load tab paper in the multi-purpose tray or paper drawer 2, and you can print onto the tabs using the Print on Tab mode.
- [Adjust One-Touch Color]
 You can make prints by selecting the look of the image with just one touch of a key.
 - [Color Balance]
 You can make fine adjustments to the color by varying the relative strength and density of yellow, magenta, cyan, and black. The color adjustments that you make can be stored and recalled for future use.

[Options] (Advanced Box, the Advanced Box of Another Machine on the Same Network, Memory Media)

- [Resolution]
 If the resolution is high, you can print fine text and images clearly.
- [Halftones]
 You can select the adjustment methods to use when printing with halftones.
- [Match Paper Size]
 You can enlarge/reduce a file image to match the paper size.
- [Enlarge Print Area]
 You can set the blank borders at each side of the page to 0" (0 mm), and print all the way to the edges of the page.
- [Password to Open a Doc.]
 You can print password protected PDF files by entering the password required to open them.
- [Print Comments]
 You can print the PDF file and all the comments.

[Booklet]

This mode enables you to print documents in such a way that the prints are made into a booklet.

- * To make a saddle stitch booklet, optional products are required.
- [N on 1]

 You can scan a file with multiple pages and reduce the size of the pages to print onto a single page. You can also specify the
- order in which to print.








Things You Can Do with the Access Stored Files Functions (Send)

This section describes things you can do when sending a file stored in a mail box, and the modes available on the [Options] screen. Select the file that you want to send from the list of stored files, press [Send], and the following screen is displayed. An optional product is required to use the Fax function.





Send Basic Features Screen (Access Stored Files)

[Address Book]

Press to select a destination from the Address Book. You can also register frequently used e-mail, I-fax, file server, or fax destinations in the Local Address Book.

[One-Touch]

If a frequently used destination is stored in a one-touch button, you can specify the destination quickly. Press [To Remote Add. Book] to specify destinations registered in the one-touch buttons of a server machine by accessing from a client machine on the network.

[New Destination]

This mode enables you to specify a new destination not stored in the Address Book or one-touch buttons.

[Send to Myself]

You can specify your own e-mail address as the destination. The administrator can restrict general users to send e-mail only to their addresses.

[Specify Destinations]

Press to display the methods for specifying destinations or the destination list.

[Personal Folder]

You can specify your personal folder as the destination. You need to specify settings before using personal folders. The administrator can restrict destination for file transmission to the operator's personal folder.

Screen for Specifying the Destination (Access Stored Files)

[Details]

You can check the detailed information for the destination selected from the address list. You can also change a new destination.

File Format

If you are sending to an e-mail address or file server, you can specify the file format. You can select from PDF, XPS, OOXML(pptx, docx), JPEG, or TIFF.

[Delete File After Sending]

Press to delete certain pages from a file.

[Delete Dest.]


Press to delete a destination displayed in the destination list.

[Cc Bcc]

Press to specify e-mail address destinations for the Cc and Bcc addresses.

[Start Sending]

Press to start sending.



[Options]

[Delayed Send]

This mode enables you to store a send job in memory, and have it sent at a later time.

[Job Done Notice]

Press to have the machine notify the user through e-mail when the send job is done.

[File Name]

If you set PDF(OCR), XPS(OCR), or OOXML(OCR) as the file format, you can set [Auto (OCR)] to 'On' to automatically extract the first text block in the document for use as its file name.

[Sender Name (TTI)]

You can register a department name or personal name in advance, and show this on the destination fax machine.

* Set the Sender Name after specifying the destination.

[E-Mail Priority]

You can set a priority level when sending e-mail.

[Reply-to]


You can specify a reply-to address when sending an e-mail or I-fax.

[Subject/Message]

You can specify a subject and enter a message when sending an e-mail or I-fax. If you do not specify a subject, it will be specified automatically.

Operating the Machine from a Computer (Remote UI)


The Remote UI (User Interface) is preinstalled software in the machine that enables you to access the machine's functions by using your computer's Web browser. For example, the Remote UI enables you to access the machine to check job status, execute jobs, and specify various settings.



To be able to use the Remote UI, all you need is a Web browser and a network connection between your computer and the machine.

The Remote UI Is Useful in the Following Situations:

- If you want to check the job status
- If you want to edit Address Book from your computer
- If you want to check the remaining amount of paper or toner from your seat



■ To enable the Remote UI:


- Log in as the administrator → specify the following settings.
 - 1. Press (Settings/Registration).
 - 2. Press [Management Settings] \rightarrow [License/Other] \rightarrow [Remote UI].
 - 3. Press [On] \rightarrow [OK].
 - 4. Turn OFF the main power of the machine, and then turn ON the main power again.

This section describes how to load paper.

Loading Paper into a Paper Drawer

If the selected paper runs out, or the selected paper drawer runs out of paper during printing, a screen prompting you to load paper appears on the touch panel display.

Follow the procedure below to load paper into the paper drawers.



CAUTION

When handling paper, take care not to cut yo ur hands on the edges of the paper.




IMPORTANT


- A screen prompting you to load paper also appears if the selected paper drawer is not fully inserted into the machine. Make sure that the paper drawer is properly in place.
- · Do not load the following types of paper into the Paper Drawer (Right/Left). Doing so may cause a paper jam.
- · Severely curled or wrinkled paper
- · Thin straw paper
- Heavy paper (more than 80 lb cover (220 g/m²))
- · Paper which has been printed on using a thermal transfer printer
- The reverse side of paper which has been printed on using a thermal transfer printer
- Coated paper
- Textured paper
- Tracing paper
- Tab paper
- Labels
- Envelopes
- Do not load the following types of paper into the Paper Drawer 3 and 4. Doing so may cause a paper jam.
- · Severely curled or wrinkled paper
- · Thin straw paper
- Heavy paper (more than 80 lb cover (220 g/m²))
- Paper which has been printed on using a thermal transfer printer
- The reverse side of paper which has been printed on using a thermal transfer printer
- Coated paper
- Textured paper
- Tracing paper
- Labels
- Envelopes
- Make sure that you fan the sheets of paper well before placing them. Thin paper, recycled paper, pre-punched paper, heavy paper, transparencies, and tab papers should be fanned particularly well before loading it.
- Never place paper or any other items in the empty part of the drawer next to the paper stack. Doing so may cause paper jams.
- When you are printing in the Staple mode, do not remove the output sheets that are waiting to be stapled. (Printing and stapling resume after you clear the paper jam.)



- Register the size and type of the loaded paper in [Paper Settings] in [Preferences] (Settings/Registration).
- You can use custom paper sizes. For more information, see e-Manual > Settings/Registration>Registering/Editing/Deleting Custom Paper Sizes.
- You can name, register, and edit custom paper types. For more information, see e-Manual > Settings/Registration>Registering/ Editing Custom Paper Types.
- The following paper sizes can be loaded into the Paper Drawer (Right/Left), and Paper Drawer 3 and 4:
- Paper Drawer (Right/Left): LTR
- Paper drawer 3 and 4: 13"x 19", 12"x 18", 12 5/8"x 17 11/16", 11"x 17", LGL, LTR, LTRR, STMTR, EXEC, and custom size (5 1/2"x 7 1/8" to 13"x 19 1/4" (139.7 mm x 182 mm to 330.2 mm x 487.7 mm))
- The paper size of the paper deck is fixed to LTR. For instructions on changing the paper size that can be loaded in the Paper Deck Unit-C1, contact your local authorized Canon dealer.
- For more information on the paper types that can be loaded in paper drawers, see e-Manual > Basic Operations.
- If a message prompting you to load paper appears during printing, the remaining prints are automatically made after you load the correct paper. If you select a different paper source, the remaining prints are made after you press [OK].
- Press [Cancel] to cancel printing.








- For high-quality printouts, use paper recommended by Canon.
- Before loading paper, always fan the sheets several times, and align the edges to facilitate feeding.

Load the paper stack into the paper drawer.

Paper Drawer 3 and 4

- Make sure that the paper size plate of the paper drawer matches the size of the paper loaded in the paper drawer.
- 2. Load the paper stack against the right wall of the paper drawer.
- Gently push the paper drawer back into the machine until it clicks into place in the closed position.



CAUTION


When returning the paper drawer to its original position, be careful not to get your fingers caught, as this may result in personal injury.



- Paper which is curled must be straightened out before loading it into the paper deck unit.
- You will not be able to make copies or print if you load paper that exceeds the loading limit mark (), or if the paper drawer is not completely pushed into the machine.
- Make sure that the height of the paper stack does not exceed the loading limit mark ().
- Always check that the paper drawers are in place.

∅ NOTE

- When loading paper into the paper drawer for the first time, set the paper size dial to match the paper size being loaded. (See "Adjusting a Paper Drawer to Hold a Different Paper Size," on p. 70.)
- Paper Drawer (Right/Left) hold approximately 1,100 sheets of paper (20 lb bond (80 g/m²)).
- The number of sheets that can be loaded in the Paper Drawer 3 and 4 is 550 sheets (20 lb bond (80 g/m²)).
- If there are instructions on the paper package about which side of the paper to load, follow those instructions.
- When the paper is loaded into the paper drawer, the side facing down is the one printed on.
- If problems, such as poor print quality or paper jams occur, try turning the paper stack over and reloading it.
- For more information on the print direction of preprinted paper (paper which has logos or patterns already printed on it), see e-Manual > Copy.
- Rewrap any remaining paper in its original package, and store it in a dry place, away from direct sunlight.
- If paper runs out and printing is stopped, load a new paper stack. Printing restarts after the new paper stack is loaded.



• If you print on the paper which has absorbed moisture, steam may come out from the output area of the machine. This is because the moist on the paper evaporates when the high temperature is applied when a toner is fixed to the paper. It is not a malfunction. (This especially happens in low room temperature.)

Adjusting a Paper Drawer to Hold a Different Paper Size

If you want to load a different size paper into a paper drawer, follow the procedure described below to adjust the paper drawer guides.




CAUTION

When handling paper, take care not to cut your hands on the edges of the paper.

Adjusting a Paper Drawer




Remove the paper loaded in the paper drawer.



- Press the open button on the paper drawer for which you want to adjust the paper size.
- 2. Grip the handle, and pull out the paper drawer until it stops.
- 3. Remove all of the remaining paper.



Adjust the position of the paper drawer guides.




- Slide the left guide while squeezing it on the top to align it with the mark for the desired paper size.
- 2. Slide the front guide while squeezing it on the top to align it with the mark for the desired paper size.



Slide the guides until they click into place. If the left guide and front guide are not aligned correctly, the paper size will not correctly appear on the touch panel display. It is also necessary to adjust the guides correctly to avoid causing a paper jam, dirty prints, or making the inside of the machine dirty.


Load the appropriate size paper into the paper drawer.



- Make sure that the paper size setting of the paper drawer matches the size of the paper to load in the paper drawer.
- Load the paper stack against the right wall of the paper drawer.



Change the paper drawer's paper size plate to match the new paper size.



- Open the inside cover of the paper drawer, and lift up the plate.
- 2. Rotate the plate so that the new paper size is on the right side of the plate.
- Insert the plate straight down, and close the inside cover.



The paper size that cannot be used depending on the model and settings is also listed on the paper size plate.



Gently push the paper drawer back into the machine until it clicks into place in the closed position.



CAUTION

When returning the paper drawer to its original position, be careful not to get your fingers caught, as this may result in personal injury.



Only LTR or LTRR transparencies can be used. Make sure that the left guide is set to 'LTR or LTRR' when loading transparencies in a paper drawer. If transparencies of a different size (other than LTR or LTRR) are loaded in a paper drawer, the paper size and remaining amount of paper will not be detected correctly.

Loading Envelopes into the Multi-Purpose Tray

Feeding direction into the multi-purpose tray differs, depending on the type of the envelopes. Preparation is required beforehand to prevent wrinkling or paper jam.

For more information, see e-Manual > Basic Operations.

Loading Pre-Punched Paper

You can load pre-punched paper to the following paper source:

- Paper Drawers of the main unit
- Multi-purpose Tray
- Paper Deck Unit-C1
- POD Deck Lite-A1
- Multi-drawer Paper Deck-A1

When loading pre-punched paper, take note of the orientation of the binding holes and the image.

When pre-punched paper is loaded in the paper drawer of the main unit, the side facing down is the one printed on. When pre-punched paper is loaded in the Multi-purpose Tray, Paper Deck Unit-C1, POD Deck Lite-A1, or Multi-drawer Paper Deck-A1, the side facing up is the one printed on.



- If you are making one-sided prints, select [Face Up (Reverse Order)] in [Face Up/Face Down]. (See e-Manual > Copy.)
- If you want to output prints with the printed face down, select plain paper with horizontal (landscape) orientation in [Select Paper]. (See e-Manual > Copy.)

Loading Transparencies

You can load the transparencies to the following paper source.

- Paper Drawers of the main unit
- · Multi-purpose Tray
- POD Deck Lite-A1
- Multi-drawer Paper Deck-A1

Transparencies have a front and back side. Load transparencies correctly to achieve sharp printing results.

When the transparency is loaded in the paper drawer of the main unit, the side facing down is the one printed on.

When the transparency is loaded in the Multi-purpose Tray, POD Deck Lite-A1, or Multi-drawer Paper Deck-A1, the side facing up is the one printed on.



- You can load only LTR or LTRR size transparencies into the Paper Drawer 3 and 4, multi-purpose tray, POD Deck Lite-A1, or Multi-drawer Paper Deck-A1. If you copy/print using LTR size transparencies, the gloss unevenness may occur. This unevenness may disappear if you use LTRR size transparencies.
- You can load only LTR size transparencies for the Paper deck Right and Left.
- You cannot load the transparencies into the Paper Deck Unit-C1, Document Insertion Unit-H1, Document Insertion/Folding Unit-G1, or Document Insertion Unit-J1.
- When loading transparencies, make sure to hold only the edges of the sheets and avoid touching the print surface.
- Do not load transparencies while the machine is printing. Doing so may cause a paper jam.
- Use only transparencies intended for use with this machine. If you use other transparencies, you may cause damage to the machine.
- It is recommended that output transparencies are immediately removed from the output tray to avoid folding of the transparencies and paper jams.
- Return the remaining transparencies to their original package for storage, avoiding locations subject to high temperatures and humidity. Leaving transparencies loaded for an extended period of time may cause the sheets to stick together and result in a paper iam.
- Leaving transparencies loaded for an extended period of time may cause the sheets to stick together and result in difficulties feeding the transparencies. In this case, fan the loaded transparency sheets, or if you have loaded 100 or more sheets, reduce the number of sheets to less than 100 or use new transparencies.
- When printing on transparencies, depending on the type of image, the image may become dense. When this happens, adjust the density for the output image.



- You can load up to 250 sheets of transparencies in a paper source other than the multi-purpose tray.
- If a paper jam occurs, fan the loaded transparency sheets well.

Loading Tab Paper

This section describes how to load tab paper.

You can load tab paper to the following paper source:

- Paper Drawer 3 and 4 of the main unit
- Multi-drawer Paper Deck-A1
- Document Insertion Unit-H1
- Document Insertion/Folding Unit-G1 / Document Insertion Unit-J1







When you load tab paper into the paper drawer or Multi-drawer Paper Deck-A1, make sure to register the paper type. (See e-Manual > Settings/Registration.)

How to Load Tab Paper

There are two kinds of tab paper: right order tab paper and reverse order tab paper.







Reverse Order Tab Paper



You cannot make copies or prints on tab paper that is loaded in the Document Insertion Unit-H1/Document Insertion/Folding Unit-G1/Document Insertion Unit-J1.



- You can use tab paper set in Document Insertion Unit-H1/Document Insertion/Folding Unit-G1/Document Insertion Unit-J1 for Add Cover, Insert Sheets or Job Separator.
- If you want to insert printed tab paper as a chapter pages, insert a blank paper where the tab paper will be inserted.



Loading Paper into the Paper Deck Unit-C1/POD Deck Lite-A1 (Optional)

If you attach the Paper Deck Unit-C1 or POD Deck Lite-A1 to the machine, you have one additional source of paper for printing jobs.

The Paper Deck Unit-C1 or POD Deck Lite-A1 hold up to 3,500 sheets of paper (20 lb bond (80 g/m²)).



If the machine is in the Sleep mode (the touch panel is not displayed, and only @(Energy Saver) is lit), you may be unable to open the paper deck unit. In this case, press @(Energy Saver) to reactivate the machine, and then press the open button on the paper deck unit.



- The Paper Deck Unit-C1 and POD Deck Lite-A1 are optional products.
- The following paper sizes can be loaded into the Paper Deck Unit-C1 or POD Deck Lite-A1:

Replacing the Toner Cartridge

When the message <Replace toner cartridge. (Black)> is displayed on the touch panel display, press on the bottom right and replace the toner cartridge for the displayed color.



When the Black toner or all of the toners run out completely and prints can no longer be made, a screen with instructions on how to replace the toner cartridge appears on the touch panel display. Follow the procedure described below to replace the toner cartridge.

If you press [Close], you can continue operations, such as setting modes and scanning originals, even if you do not replace the toner cartridge immediately.





WARNING

- Do not burn or throw used toner cartridges into open flames, as this may cause the toner to ignite, resulting in burns or a fire.
- If you accidentally spill or scatter toner, carefully gather the toner particles together or wipe them up with a soft, damp cloth in a way that prevents inhalation. Never use a vacuum cleaner that does not have safeguards against dust explosions to clean up spilled toner. Doing so may cause a malfunction in the vacuum cleaner, or result in a dust explosion due to static discharge.



CAUTION

- · Keep toner out of the reach of small children.
- If toner is ingested, consult a physician immediately.
- If toner gets onto your hands or clothing, wash it off immediately with cold water. Washing it off with warm water will set the toner, and make it impossible to remove the toner stains.



- Use only toner cartridges intended for use with this machine.
- For information on the supported Canon genuine toner, see "Consumables," on p. 144.
- Do not replace toner cartridges until the message prompting you to do so appears.
- You can replace a toner cartridge while the machine is printing.
- The color of the toner to be replaced is displayed on the touch panel display. If multiple toner cartridges must be replaced, replace the toner cartridges in the following order: Black, Yellow, Magenta, Cyan.
- If you continue copying or printing in black-and-white after cyan, magenta, or yellow toner runs out, do not remove the depleted toner cartridges from the machine.
- You can display an error message informing the user that the remaining toner is low. For instructions on displaying the remaining toner error message, see e-Manual > Settings/Registration. For instructions on deleting the remaining toner error message, see e-Manual > Settings/Registration.



- Complete instructions on how to replace the toner cartridge can be accessed by pressing [Previous] or [Next] on the touch panel display.
- If toner runs out during a print job, the remaining prints are made after you replace the toner cartridge.
- If black toner is left, you can continue copying and printing in black-and-white. However, if a job is interrupted because cyan, magenta, or yellow toner runs out, copying and printing in black-and-white is only possible for functions other than the function being used for the interrupted job.
- After replacing toner cartridges, if printed colors are different from the colors printed before you replaced the toner cartridges, perform an [Auto Adjust Gradation] in [Adjustment/Maintenance] (Settings/Registration). (See e-Manual > Settings/Registration.)





- Platen glass
- Underside of the feeder
- Wires
- Rollers
- Drums

If the touch panel display becomes dirty and the screen may not be seen clearly, clean the touch panel display. Since the touch panel display becomes dirty from normal use, we recommend that you clean it once a week or every 10 days.



WARNING

- When cleaning the machine, first turn OFF the main power switch, and disconnect the power cord. Failure to observe these steps may result in a fire or electrical shock.
- Disconnect the power cord from the power outlet regularly, and clean the area around the base of
 the power plug's metal pins and the power outlet with a dry cloth to ensure that all dust and grime is
 removed. If the power cord is connected for a long period of time in a damp, dusty, or smoky location,
 dust can build up around the power plug and become damp. This may cause a short circuit and result in
 a fire.



- When cleaning with a cloth, do not dampen it too much, as this may damage the original or break the machine.
- Do not use alcohol, benzene, paint thinner, or other solvents for cleaning. Doing so may result in damage to the plastic parts.

Platen Glass and Underside of the Feeder


If the platen glass or the underside of the feeder is dirty, the original may not be scanned clearly, or the size of the original may be detected incorrectly. Clean the platen glass and the underside of the feeder by following the procedure below.

Clean the platen glass and the underside of the feeder with a cloth which is wrung after being dampened in water or a mild detergent, and then wipe them clean with a soft, dry cloth.

Manual Feeder Cleaning

If originals that have been fed through the feeder have streaks or appear dirty, clean the feeder's scanning area. Clean the feeder's scanning area with a cloth which is wrung after being dampened in water, and then wipe them clean with a soft, dry cloth.





Press [Adjustment/Maintenance] \rightarrow [Maintenance] \rightarrow [Clean Feeder].



Place 10 sheets of blank paper into the feeder \rightarrow press [Start].

It takes approximately 20 seconds to clean the feeder.

Use normal LTR size paper.

When cleaning is complete, try scanning again.

- To cancel feeder cleaning while it is in progress, press [Cancel].

Wire Cleaning

If streaks appear on printed output or random parts of the printed image are missing, clean the corona assembly wires inside the main unit.

It takes approximately 35 seconds to clean the wire. When cleaning is complete, try printing again.

Roller Cleaning

If dirt or streaks appear on printed output, clean the roller inside of the main unit.



Press (Settings/Registration).



 $\textbf{Press [Adjustment/Maintenance]} \rightarrow \textbf{[Maintenance]} \rightarrow \textbf{[Clean Roller]}.$



Press [Start].

It takes approximately 20 seconds to clean the roller. When cleaning is complete, try printing again.



Roller cleaning cannot be performed during printing.

Drum Cleaning

Printed images may be light or distorted when the machine is used immediately after installation or after a long period time of not using the machine. If printed images are light or distorted, clean the drum inside the machine as necessary.



Press (Settings/Registration).



 $\textbf{Press [Adjustment/Maintenance]} \rightarrow \textbf{[Maintenance]} \rightarrow \textbf{[Clean Drum]}.$



Press [Start].

It takes approximately 35 seconds to clean the drum. When cleaning is complete, try printing again.







Toner comes in four colors: black, cyan, magenta, and yellow.



Clearing Paper Jams

If a paper jam occurs, a screen with animation indicating how to clear the jam or a screen with list indicating the order to clear the jam appears on the touch panel display. Check the location of the paper jam, and follow the instructions on the screen to clear the paper jam. The screen is displayed repeatedly until the paper jam is cleared. If you press [Close], you can continue operations, such as setting modes or scanning originals, even if the jammed paper is not removed immediately.

WARNING

Some areas inside the machine are subject to high-voltages. When removing jammed paper or when inspecting the inside of the machine, do not allow necklaces, bracelets, or other metal objects to touch the inside of the machine, as this may result in burns or electrical shock.

Reducing the Frequency of Paper Jams

If paper jams occur frequently, even though there is no apparent problem with the machine, either one of the following two reasons may be the cause. Follow the instructions described below to reduce the frequency of paper jams.


- There are torn pieces of paper left inside the machine.

 Pulling jammed paper out of the machine by force may leave parts of the paper torn inside, leading to frequent paper jams. If paper tears while you are trying to remove jammed paper from the machine, make sure that you remove all of the torn pieces.
- The paper loaded in the paper drawer differs from the setting.

 Make sure that the paper loaded in the paper drawer matches the paper size/type registered in [Paper Settings] in [Preferences] (Settings/Registration).



Approximately 6,000 pages of that total is shared by the various functions, including the Copy; Fax; Scan and Send; Scan and Store (Store in Mail Box); Fax/I-Fax Inbox; and, printing from computer functions. In addition, each function is guaranteed to be able to store the following number of pages:

Copy: 100 pages

Print From Computer: 100 pages (excluding Secure Print jobs)

For example, the Copy function can store up to approximately 6,100 pages of scanned images.

6,000 + 100 = 6,100 pages (approximate figures)

However, the number of pages that the machine's memory can store may differ, depending on the amount of memory required for files stored in the Mail Box and Fax/I-Fax Inbox, and jobs that are in the print queue.

If memory becomes full during the scanning of originals, a message will appear on the touch panel display.



- When using Fax/Scan and Send, you can send up to 999 pages at one time.
- Delete any unnecessary files in the Mail Box and Fax/I-Fax Inbox to free up memory.

For the Copy Function

Follow the directions below based on the message that appears on the touch panel display.

If the message <Scanning will be canceled because the memory is full. Do you want to print the scanned pages?> appears:

[Yes]: The pages scanned into memory are printed. When printing is complete, scan the remaining originals.

[OK]: Returns to the Basic Features screen of the function you are using. Scan the job again when the current job is complete.
