Hiragana First Row Practice

こんにちは! Hello! I'm Sparky, your Japanese practice partner! 💷

Today we'll practice three important beginner skills:

- Hiragana Practice Writing and recognizing basic characters
- Greetings Essential daily expressions
- Numbers 1-5 Counting basics

Let's start with whichever area you'd like to focus on first. What would you like to practice - hiragana characters, greetings, or numbers?

> Let's practice hiragana characters. I want to practice writing the fist row



Great choice! Let's practice the first row of hiragana: あ, い, う, え, お

These are the five vowel sounds in Japanese:

- あ (a) pronounced "ah"
- い(i) pronounced "ee"
- う (u) pronounced "oo"
- え(e) pronounced "eh"
- お (o) pronounced "oh"

Try writing each character. You can type them if you're able to, or describe how you're writing them. Let's start with あ (a) - give it a try and I'll help you with the proper form!

Remember, focus on getting the basic shape right. Take your time with each stroke.





I see you wrote: あ, い, う, え, み

I notice that the first four characters are correct - あ (a), い (i), う (u), え (e) - but the last character should be お (o), not み (mi).

The $\ensuremath{\mathcal{B}}$ character you wrote is actually from a different row (the "ma" row). The correct fifth character for the vowel row should be $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{B}}$ (o).

Your stroke formation on the first four characters looks good! The shapes are recognizable and well-formed.

Can you try writing 3 (o) to complete the vowel row? The 3 character has a more rectangular shape with horizontal lines, quite different from the 3 you wrote.





l see you wrote: か, さ, く, け, こ

Wait - I was expecting you to practice writing お (o) to complete the vowel row あいうえお, but instead you've moved on to writing characters from the "ka" and "sa" rows!

Let me check what you intended: Did you mean to write かきくけこ (the ka row)? Because what you actually wrote is a mix - you have か (ka), さ (sa), く (ku), け (ke), こ (ko).

The correct ka row should be: かきくけこ (ka, ki, ku, ke, ko)

You wrote \updeta correctly, but then wrote \updeta (sa) instead of \updeta (ki). The rest - \uplambda , \updata , \updata - are correct for their positions.

Was this intentional, or did you mean to write the complete ka row? Your stroke formation looks good on all the characters you did write!
